

Description - provide a brief overview of the project plan:

Funds for this project will buy level appropriate books for classroom Extensive Reading Libraries. To foster the critical development of reading skills, students are required to read 30 minutes/day in an appropriate level book. However, access to these books is challenging, as our library has few if any books at appropriate levels. This problem is compounded by the fact that as language learners our students are limited in their ability to choose and purchase appropriate reading books if they don't have access on campus. These funds would allow us to purchase books so that students have access to level appropriate reading material in order to meet class requirements and fulfill student learning outcomes.

The ultimate outcome goal is to increase student success by providing interesting, level appropriate reading material for all current and future beginning level ESL students. Successful completion at beginning level classes helps encourage students to continue ESL studies at the college. Students who complete their ESL program at LPC have a 100% pass rate in English 1A so providing the resources the students need at lower levels is critical.

The benefits of extensive reading to language learners are compelling. Extensive reading can help students to build general English language fluency, including listening and speaking skills, increase reading confidence, including the ability to read without translation, all leading to enhanced academic competence. In addition, extensive reading promotes a positive attitude toward reading and creates a community of readers encouraging positive classroom experiences and discussions. However, it does require a lot of practice which means that we can increase student success and achievement rates if we can provide more books for them to read.

The library at LPC has a great selection of appropriate books for our upper level ESL students, but unfortunately does not have appropriate beginning level materials. The LPC ESL department has worked hard to provide our students with excellent resources, with the collections for some classes including up to eight reading levels, so that students can select books that are interesting and appropriate for their reading ability. This grant will help solve the problem of insufficient extensive reading materials for our lower level students.

The books being requested are an integral part of the ESL curriculum and could be used and re-used each semester providing excellent return on investment and long term benefits to the students and program.
